During his 10-month artist residency at Greenwich House in New York, Christopher Adams created a new body of work of glossy, otherworldly creatures — an experiment in artificial evolution. Influenced by his biology background, Adams illustrates the concept of adaptive radiation (when an organism enters an unpopulated environment and differentiates rapidly) in with his surreal series of animal-like forms. Hung against an acidic, yellow backdrop, the handbuilt sculptures are laid out on display like exotic specimens. The
