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Women in the Arts Unite For Prestigious Art Fair in NYC This May

Garvey|Simon and Raft of Sanity come together to present work by two women artists during the inaugural New York Arts Week 2022



New York, NY— One of the most talked about new art fairs of 2021, *Future Fair*, is back again this spring, continuing their unique concept that promotes collaboration between galleries and the presentation of underrepresented artists.

Among the new collaborative exhibitors for this year's edition are women run galleries Raft of Sanity, a new venture based in Buffalo, and NYC based Garvey|Simon Gallery founded in 2010. Together these galleries will jointly present sculptures by Roberley Bell and paintings by Sandy Litchfield.

Recognizing a shared formal language, Bell and Litchfield have engaged in an ongoing conversation about landscape, metamorphosis and growth. Their Future Fair presentation pairs unexpected colors and distinctive compositions in both painting and sculpture, presenting an interplay of intention, invention and enigma.

Inspired by nature and also a sense of time and place, the works are expansive and intricate, abstract and representational, suggesting both the ordinary and extraordinary found in our surroundings.

Future Fair will be held in the Chelsea Industrial Building at 28th Street and 10th Avenue in Manhattan this May. It runs May 5–7, 2022 with a VIP preview on the evening of May 4, 2022.

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About Roberley Bell

Roberley Bell is inspired by nature and time. Her practice draws on the world around her, in particular the scrutiny of nature and the built environment. Bell has had numerous residencies including the Cite International in Paris, Stadt Künstlerhaus, Salzburg, Austria, The International Studio Program, NYC and Sculpture Space, Utica NY. Bell's work has been exhibited internationally, including, Alan Gallery Istanbul, Medea Gallery Malmö, Sweden, deCordova Museum and Sculpture Park, The Virginia Museum of Fine Arts, Black and White Gallery Brooklyn. She has completed public projects in cities internationally, including, Istanbul, Turkey; Kaliningrad, Russia; Chicago, Pittsburgh, Cambridge and Cleveland. She has participated in several art fairs, including Art Miami, Scope New York and Contemporary Art Istanbul.

Bell is the recipient of numerous fellowships including awards from the New York Foundation for the Arts, a Pollock Krasner Fellowship, and a Senior Scholar Fulbright to Turkey. As a Fulbright Specialist Bell has been leading walking workshops internationally. Workshops have been held in Sharjah, UAE; Istanbul, Turkey and Malmö, Sweden. Her book Do You Know This tree? Published by Visual Studies Workshop, Rochester, New York is the cumulation of a ten-year walking project in Istanbul.

Bell lives in Western Massachusetts, maintaining a studio in Easthampton, MA.

About Sandy Litchfield

Born in New York City, Sandy Litchfield now lives in Amherst, Massachusetts where she is an Associate Professor at the University of Massachusetts' Department of Architecture. She received her BFA from the University of Colorado in Boulder and her MFA from UMass Amherst. In 2007 she attended the Skowhegan School of Painting and Sculpture. Her work has been recognized with grants and commissions from the Public Art for Public Schools, the Massachusetts Cultural Council, and the Puffin Foundation. Litchfield has exhibited in numerous museums including the DeCordova Museum and Sculpture Park, The Fitchburg Art Museum, The Portland Art Museum and The Hunterdon Museum. Her exhibitions have been selected for review by The Brooklyn Rail, The Boston Phoenix, New American Paintings and The Boston Globe. She was recently awarded a major public commission for 2021 MTA Arts and Design, Long Island Railroad in New Hyde Park, NY.
